## **PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER**

### **NOTICE OF EXTENSION TO GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARY CHESTERFIELD (NO 3) 2026**

#### **Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and policing Act 2014**

#### **Part 4, Section 60**

TAKE NOTICE that Chesterfield Borough Council has extended the geographical area of the Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPO) Chesterfield (No 1) 2017 and (No 2) 2023.

The proposed change to the geographical boundary is shown on the attached map.

The Public Spaces Protection Orders Chesterfield (No1) 2017, (No 2) 2023 and this order (No 3) 2026 are in force and are due to expire on the 15<sup>th</sup> of December 2026.

The other terms of the (No 1) 2017 and (No 2) 2023 Orders remain unchanged and will become applicable to the new geographical area identified in this order (No 3).

The extension to the geographical boundary is titled the Public Spaces Protection Order Chesterfield (No 3) 2026.

The effect of the PSPO (No 1) 2017 Order means that any person in the restricted area designated by PSPO (No 1) 2017 Order (which applies to public places in Chesterfield town centre area), on the request of a Police Constable, Police Community Support Officer or an authorised Council Officer, must not consume, or must stop consuming, alcohol and surrender it, or any container for alcohol, to the authorised person.

It is an offence if a person, without reasonable excuse, fails to comply with the requirements of the PSPO (No 1) 2017 Order and such a person, if convicted of an offence, is liable to a fine not exceeding £500;

alternatively, an authorised person may issue a Fixed Penalty Notice of £100.


The PSPO (No 1) 2017 does not apply to the consumption of alcohol on licensed premises.

PSPO (No 2) 2023 applies to public places in the Chesterfield town centre area and contains a number of prohibitions and requirements relating to tents (and other temporary structures); persons causing nuisance, alarm, harassment or distress, loitering and begging, urination and defecation; unattended material and paraphernalia, and intoxicating substances.

It is an offence if a person, without reasonable excuse, fails to comply with any of the prohibitions or requirements of the PSPO (No 2) 2023 and such a person, if convicted of an offence, is liable to a fine not exceeding £1000; alternatively, an authorised person (a Police Officer, Community Support Officer or an authorised council Officer) may issue a Fixed penalty Notice of £100.
